1. Introduction

Natural Capital Ireland "NCI" was fortunate to receive support from the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage ("DHLGH") through the National Parks & Wildlife Service ("NPWS") for 2024 in the form of core grant assistance of 30,000EUR. This report provides NPWS with an update on work enabled by this funding, as well as its impact and where we see the work developing under NPWS support in future.

2. Background

NCI is a not-for-profit organisation leading the conversation on natural capital in Ireland. NCI is governed by a board of directors, advised by a steering committee and administered by a Secretariat and research team. The organisation was founded in 2014 as the Irish Forum on Natural Capital and has been successfully raising awareness of the approach within Ireland via research, reports, outreach and a growing network of contacts and followers in the areas of policy, academia, NGOs, public and private sectors.

2.1 Vision

Our vision is for an Ireland in which natural capital and ecosystem goods and services are valued, protected and restored.

2.2 Mission

Our mission is to value, protect and restore Ireland's natural capital and ecosystem services. We will do this by supporting the adoption of natural capital concepts in public policy and corporate strategy, promoting informed public and private sector decision-making, and assisting in the establishment of a national natural capital accounting standard.

2.3 Members

NCI has a growing number of official members and 1,450+ followers across academia, public and private sectors, NGOs and interested individuals. Subscription is free and all receive our monthly newsletter and opportunities to contribute to the natural capital agenda.

2.4 Funding

NCI is currently funded by both the National Parks and Wildlife Service, under the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage and by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine. NCI has previously also received grant assistance from the Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications.

4. NCI Funded Projects

Report: <u>High-level Recommendations on Funding Nature Restoration in Ireland</u>

Natural Capital Ireland was commissioned by the Irish Environmental Network (IEN) to deliver a report on high-level recommendations for funding nature restoration in Ireland. On June 28, 2024, we brought

together a diverse group of subject matter experts from academia, business, environmental NGOs, agriculture, government departments, and semi-state bodies to workshop high-level recommendations for funding nature restoration, which are set out in this report.



• Background With the EU Nature Restoration Law (NRL) adopted by the European Council on 17th June 2024, the Irish Environmental Network and Natural Capital Ireland felt it timely to grapple with the 'how-tos' of financing the implementation of Ireland's National Restoration Plan (NRP), which is being formulated by the National Parks and Wildlife Service. The workshop included presentations by NPWS Áinle Ní Bhriain and biodiversity finance consultant Craig Bullock. On the basis of workshop discussions detailed in the report, we compiled seven key recommendations in relation to funding nature restoration.



- Key recommendations for Funding Nature Restoration in Ireland:
 - 1. Invest in an overarching nature restoration plan
 - 2. Rebuild trust
 - 3. Mainstream biodiversity
 - 4. Boost capacity
 - 5. Scale up success
 - 6. Multi-annual funding
 - 7. Blended funding both public & private See full report for details.
- Impact The Report was issued by IEN on their website and presented to the Minister for Nature
 Malcolm Noonan at the COP16 Global Summit on Biodiversity in Colombia by Fintan Kelly, IEN.
- Next Steps NCI will continue to promote and disseminate the report, and will seek funding to do
 a follow-up workshop report or larger piece of research with a focus on private and blended
 funding for nature restoration as there is a growing interest and rapid development in this area.

INCASE project - complete

- Background NCI was a partner on the EPA-funded multi-year Irish Natural Capital Accounting for Sustainable Environments (INCASE) project which reached its conclusion in 2023. The project piloted the creation of natural capital accounts at catchment scale in Ireland to investigate how natural capital accounting (specifically the System of Environmental Economic Accounting Ecosystem Accounting approach) can assist with reporting and/or working towards nature restoration across a range of land cover areas including, agricultural, peatlands, freshwater systems, forests, industrial and urban sites, particularly water protection and management in the context of implementation of the Water Framework Directive (WFD) / River Basin Management Plan (RBMP) for Ireland in the period 2022–2027.
- Impact The final report for the INCASE project was published by the EPA in late 2023 and launched with a well-attended event aimed at policymakers in Trinity College Dublin. In 2024, NCI continued to share the project's groundbreaking findings via workshops, presentations, and outreach, with Dr Catherine Farrell delivering a presentation of findings at the <u>Natural Capital</u> Symposium in Stanford in the US in Q2 of 2024.
- In Q3, the INCASE team were asked to provide their insights for a chapter in a forthcoming book on the learnings and challenges involved in large-scale multi-disciplinary environmental projects.
- Next Steps The project report recommendations will continue to be shared by NCI and to
 provide a valuable touchstone for future natural capital research projects and practical initiatives
 in Ireland and abroad.

ForES Project - ongoing

- Background NCI were contracted for 48 months by the ForES project team for their Knowledge Transfer Plan, Communications and Dissemination. The aim of the ForES project is to develop decision support tools (DSTs) to enable management of the entire Coillte estate (forest and non-forested areas), as well as privately owned forests, for balanced delivery of multiple ecosystem services using a Natural Capital Accounting framework to support modelling. These tools will enable forest owners to deliver economic, social and environmental benefits across their estates. NCI's role is to deliver on a Knowledge Transfer Plan and ensure strong communication and dissemination of the project activities.
- Throughout 2024, NCI has promoted a number of outputs, and a feedback survey to engage private foresters. Deirdre Lane and Fiona Smith attended an online project update with presentations by Francesco Martini on creating ecosystem accounts and condition accounts, an update on creating a Bayesian Belief Network model from PhD candidate Kathleen Conroy, and a demonstration of an early-stage working model of the tool from new post-doc Matheus Etges. As well as attending Steering Committee meetings and maintaining regular contact with the team, NCI's Communications Executive Fiona Smith invited project postdoc Francesco Martini to

present on the project at an online meet-up to update on fellow natural capital projects in Ireland, bringing together the CSO, VniC Health and Nature+Energy.

- Impact The team has also published a number of papers, including in collaboration with the Nature+Energy wind project, and delivered blogs with insights on their work, which were disseminated online and uploaded on the ForES website by NCI. The project continues to gather subscribers for its newsletter (x 60) and post regular social media updates. There are 1,300+ followers to date on ForES social media channels, across LinkedIn, Twitter and Instagram.
- Next Steps NCI will continue to support delivery of workshops and communications relating to
 the project, as well as hosting and supporting opportunities for networking between natural
 capital projects at home and abroad and dissemination of outputs. The team will release an
 open-access tool to help foresters make sustainable decisions at the end of the project in
 2025/26, and continue to engage with private foresters for further feedback and promotion of
 the tool.

Business for Biodiversity Ireland Platform

- Background Business for Biodiversity Ireland (BFBI) is a multi-stakeholder platform supported by Business in the Community Ireland (BITCI) and the National Biodiversity Data Centre (NBDC), seed-funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food & the Marine and the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage/NPWS and is a project of NCI up until November 2024, when seed-funding contract period ended and the platform spun out as a CLG entity with its own Board. NCI secretariat Fiona Smith and Dr. Emer Ní Dhúill still operate as Comms Executive and Head of Research for BFBI and NCI will retain strong links as a supporter of the platform. The initiative aims to encourage and incentivise businesses to assess their impacts and dependencies on nature and to develop robust and meaningful biodiversity strategies that align with prevailing standards and frameworks and comply with the corporate sustainability reporting directive. The project is progressing a number of actions in support of the 4th National Biodiversity Action Plan 2023-2030.
- Impact BFBI has successfully harnessed the global momentum around nature action and injected it into the Irish conversation. Since its beginning in November 2021, the platform has been engaged in industry research, corporate outreach and global networking. In 2024, it produced a Biodiversity Duty guidance document for Public Bodies, a Biodiversity Skills Gap Survey for Irish Businesses, both in conjunction with NPWS, and also contributed to a module on the frameworks for a move to Nature Positive and preparing businesses for Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive requirements at Trinity Business School with NCI's Dr Catherine Farrell. This work means that Ireland now sits at the "business and nature" frontier, and as a national platform, BFBI are viewed as leaders in terms of the practical application of developing frameworks. The work of the platform has progressed the nature conversation in Ireland which, as the platform matures, will hopefully translate to better awareness, appropriate action, upskilling and improved reporting and transparency in both Irish corporates and SMEs.

Next steps BFBI launched a new membership drive in late 2024 with revised offerings based on
consultations with EU platforms and <u>Business For Nature</u>'s guidance, which it is rolling out to
new businesses and partners. Read more in the <u>BFBI Annual Report 2024</u> as previously
submitted by NCI to NPWS.

NCI work using core funding:

Policy Working Group (PWG)

NCI's PWG team is Dr Emer Ní Dhúill, NCI Researcher, Fiona Smith, NCI Communications Executive and Noeleen Smyth, NCI Steering Committee Member. The PWG typically meets monthly to discuss upcoming/ongoing public consultation. The remit of the PWG is to:

- To respond to <u>public consultations</u> (from government, local authorities, agencies, etc.)
- To bring the natural capital approach to the forefront of the national conversation
- To show policymakers how effectively the natural capital approach can be in revealing the range of benefits, and costs, involved in each policy
- To show how the natural capital approach is vital to creating a common metric across policy areas hitherto confined in silos, and thus harmonise policies across all areas in the interests of true and measurable sustainability

The <u>PWG</u> took a temporary partial hiatus in 2024 due to capacity challenges with a smaller than usual team of just two contractors and lack of an Executive Coordinator for H1 of the year. In H2, with a General Election looming, it was deemed more prudent to concentrate on strategy development and paid project work and return to making submissions when the new government is in place in 2025. Three public consultation responses were submitted in 2024.

Data hub

- Background As part of our strategic goal to maintain a leading data hub on natural capital, NCI's
 website is updated frequently with blogs, event listings and project updates.
- Impact NCI published 12 blogs in 2024 with well over 1,000 views, and collated hundreds of events conferences, webinars and government consultations on our <u>site calendar</u>, issued a monthly newsletter to our growing bank of 1,400+ subscribers and maintained an <u>archive</u> of all our past newsletters.
- Next steps We will continue to publish regular blogs and newsletters and keep our calendar
 updated to provide our increasing subscriber base with a valuable source on the latest
 environmental and natural capital data.

NCI is currently compiling financial insights on funding and service providers for nature and biodiversity with a view to starting a registry of environmental and nature restoration projects, and partners, subject to funding and capacity.

Social media and digital outreach

- Background NCI maintains several social media accounts across several platforms Including
 <u>Twitter</u> and <u>LinkedIn</u> for daily updates on our work, (and on <u>YouTube</u> where we host educational
 videos) while engaging and monitoring environmental and natural capital associated accounts.
- Impact Subscribers across all platforms have increased year on year and again in 2024 our social media subscribers are now over 3,200 on LinkedIn, with similar numbers on X/Twitter. We have also gained 400 for our more recent Instagram account. Thousands more have engaged with the social media accounts for the various projects run by NCI, including INCASE, ForES and Business For Biodiversity Ireland. We have over 1,400 subscribers to our monthly NCI newsletter, which according to the mailer service analytics, consistently performs 5-10pc better than our peers in terms of opens and clicks, with an average of 41% of our subscribers staying highly engaged with our natural capital content.
- Next steps We aim to continue to expand our follower base across all platforms, while
 monitoring the emergence of new social media channels and trends to ensure we are reaching
 as wide an audience as possible, setting KPIs for follower numbers and engagement levels.
 We plan to migrate to bsky.social due to its growing popularity but maintain the Twitter account
 for the time being to reach both audiences.

NCI major public outreach events

National Economic and Social Council (NESC)

- Background The National Economic and Social Council (NESC) advises the Taoiseach on strategic
 policy issues relating to sustainable, economic, social and environmental development in Ireland.
 On foot of Action 83 of the Climate Action Plan 2021, NCI was commissioned by NESC to support
 their project Accounting for Nature in Ireland by delivering the following three roundtables as
 rapporteurs in May and June 2023.
- In early 2024, NESC published the NCI briefing paper to inform policymakers in advance of three
 roundtables on natural capital and natural capital accounting, and our Rapporteurs report
 setting out the themes that emerged from the policy dialogue. They also launched the final
 workshop report, Natural Capital Accounting in Ireland: A Guide for Action
- Impact NCI's participated in the launch event in Q1 Making Nature Visible: What Can Natural
 Capital Do For Us? in Dublin at which several NCI members presented their views on the subject
 and took part in discussion panels, including Dr Catherine Farrell, Dr Emer Ní Dhúill and Niall

NCI held an in-person strategy workshop at the Marine Institute in Galway in September 2024, hosted by NCI Executive Coordinator Deirdre Lane, with several Board members in attendance and the Steering Committee Chair and secretariat dialling in. As well as a strategy discussion, NCI also heard enlightening presentations on the work of the Marine Institute from CEO Dr Rick Officer, Fisheries Advisor Dr Oliver Tully and co-founder of local native oyster restoration group Cuan Beo Colm O'Dowd, who shared their impactful insights in terms of working with local stakeholders to advance the ocean economy and marine protection and restoration.

This was followed by a round-table session at University of Galway in conjunction with <u>Sustainable</u> <u>Development Goals Week</u> for those interested in learning more about the natural capital approach for an exchange of ideas on nature restoration and collaboration. The event was promoted on the official European Sustainable Development Week website and also constituted a celebration of 10 years of NCI, with more commemorations to follow in 2025.


Convening stakeholders for natural capital project updates

In October, we hosted a webinar with teams from a variety of natural capital projects operating in Ireland to update on their progress creating accounts in various sectors to compare notes on both the challenges and the fantastic progress in developing tools to facilitate decision-making for nature

- in urban communities for health VNiC-Health's Dr Jimmy O'Keeffe
- at windfarm scale Nature+Energy Project's Emma King
- for sustainable forestry ForES Project's Francesco Martini
- for many aspects within our national accounts including crop pollination services from the CSO's Sam Belton.

Natural Capital Dashboard Demo



Natural Capital Dashboard: In November 2024, we hosted Mark Eigenraam of IDEEA Group, Australian pioneers of the System of Environmental Economic Accounting - Ecosystem Accounting, for a demonstration of the workings of the new Natural Capital dashboard they have developed which allows organisations to make tailored natural capital accounts based on their input. The dashboard uses the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting to compile ecosystem data to facilitate environmental reporting and informed decision-making by organisations, including Governments at national level and primary producers at farm scale.

The breakfast webinar and discussion hosted by NCI Communications Executive Fiona Smith was attended by members of the NCI Steering Committee and selected invited guests from natural capital projects working with accounts data and web tools including the CSO, ForES project and VniC Health.

Participation in Natural Capital Workshops:

CSO Ecosystem Accounts Stakeholder Forum

- Background The Central Statistics Office (CSO) set up an Ecosystem Accounts Division (EAD) in 2020 tasked with developing <u>Irish ecosystem accounts</u> using the SEEA-EA framework. The EAD has begun to compile extent and condition accounts as part of its SEEA-EA implementation. The EAD is also preparing for future reporting of ecosystem accounts to Eurostat (the statistical office of the European Union) which will entail mandatory reporting on ecosystem extent, some condition indicators, and selected ecosystem services.
- NCI's Deirde Lane and Dr. Jimmy O'Keefe attended the in-person CSO Stakeholder Forum on Ecosystem Accounting on 12th September 2024, with updates from the CSO on the development of Ecosystem Accounting in Ireland, followed by a session highlighting current research in ecosystem accounting, ecosystem services, and earth observation data for ecosystem accounts.
 NCI participated in workshop breakout rooms on Data, Research, and Policy, each aimed at fostering conversations and identifying needs. There was discussion around the Nature Restoration Law, on how we can use ecosystem accounts for target setting and monitoring of indicators.
- Impact NCI has made good connections with the CSO EAD team and extended stakeholder network which will continue to grow. The CSO's Sam Belton and Nova Sharkey have participated in a number of NCI-hosted events in 2024, with Sam presenting on developing national accounts for an online event sharing progress on natural capital accounting projects in Ireland.
- Next steps National accounts are under development, and can be applied in policy once
 international guidance provided by Eurostat is finalised. The need for spatial data in policy, e.g.
 for geo-specific measures and results-based payments was noted. Ecosystem accounts,
 especially marine accounts will be very useful for marine spatial planning, including activities at
 sea.

Galvanising Change via Natural Capital

- Background In Q4, NCI Executive Coordinator Deirdre Lane and researcher Dr Emer Ní Dhúill participated in an event hosted by the <u>James Hutton Institute</u> to synthesise a range of experiences of working with natural capital in and for policy-making in different countries. Hosts: Dr Kerry Waylen, Dr Diana Valero, Dr Simone Martino, Ms Rebecca Gray with Ms Donya Davidson, Prof Ian Bateman, Dr Joachim Maes, Dr Paola Ovando, Mr Peter Clough, Dr Ruth Waters, Dr Bram Edens, Dr Riikka Paloniemi, Prof Rob Alkemade and Prof Zhiyun Ouyang.
- Impact This workshop explored what type of activities have been tried; what has achieved influence and why; and identified implications for future research and policy.

• **Next steps** A workshop report, co-authored by participants, will be produced and disseminated, which will ideally lead to an academic paper.

Increasing outreach with our stakeholders and networks

Fiona Smith participated in a stakeholder feedback workshop for the VniC-Health project at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, exploring the multiple benefits of green spaces.

Dr Emer Ni Dhuill and Deirdre Lane were active participants in several environmental related projects including on Doughnut Economics, Sustainable Finance and Bioeconomy, see Table 1 above. In particular, Deirdre met with a number of varied stakeholders at the National Ploughing Championships in Ratheniska, Co Laois.
